

The Miracle of St. Athanasius in the Boat

The Synaxarion of the 30th day of the Coptic Month of Thoout (October 10)

Learning about how the Lord Jesus Christ was with St. Athanasius teaches us that the Lord is our salvation.

Long ago, there was a man named Arius. Arius used to teach wrong things about our Lord Jesus Christ in the church. He said that our Lord Jesus Christ is not God.

The church did not like his teachings and had a council, or big meeting about it. Many bishops from all around the world came to the council. At the council, there was a deacon named **St. Athanasius**.

St. Athanasius gave the correct teaching that our Lord Jesus Christ is God and He was born from the Virgin St. Mary to save us all.



St. Athanasius fought for the right faith strongly, and God chose him to become the 20th Pope of the Coptic Orthodox Church. He taught people about God everywhere he went. One day, St. Athanasius heard about a king who believed the wrong teachings of Arius. St. Athanasius went to see that king and taught him the right faith, teaching him that our Lord Jesus Christ was born to save us.

When the king heard the right teachings, he was very angry and told his soldiers to put St. Athanasius on a small boat with no food or water and to leave him in the sea.





God sent angels to keep the boat safe, and it sailed smoothly on the sea. The angels protected St. Athanasius until he came safely to Alexandria (a city in Egypt).

The Christian people were so happy and welcomed his safe return, holding candles and singing hymns praising God.

The Church Prays for St. Peter
Acts 12:1-17

This story teaches us that praying together is a refuge in our lives and protects us.

After our Lord Jesus Christ ascended to Heaven, King Herod took St. Peter and put him in jail. He was tied with a chain on each of his hands. Each chain was attached to a soldier, and the room was locked and guarded by 2 more soldiers. The king wanted to make sure that St. Peter could not leave.

St. Peter was not afraid in the jail. He was very calm and fell asleep.



While St. Peter was in jail, the believers came together in the house of Mary, the mother of

St. Mark. They spent the entire night praying for St. Peter.



God sent an angel to the jail and the dark room became very bright. The angel touched St. Peter and said, "Arise quickly". The chains fell off St. Peter's hands, and the angel told him to put on his shoes, belt, and clothes and follow him out of the prison.

St. Peter thought he was dreaming. He followed the angel out of the jail. St. Peter and the angel went out of the jail, and once they were down the road, the angel went away. St. Peter knew that he was not dreaming, and that God had sent the angel to save him.

St. Peter went to the house of Mary (the mother of St. Mark). When he knocked on the door, a girl named Rhoda came to the door. She was so happy to know that St. Peter was standing outside, but she didn't open the door for him.

She went back inside to tell everyone that St. Peter was at the door. St. Peter kept on knocking on the door. When they opened the door, they were very surprised to see him. St. Peter told them how the Lord saved him.



By the prayers of all the believers praying together, our Lord Jesus Christ returned St. Peter home from jail, and the people were very happy and thanked the Lord.

David was the son of Jesse. He had 7 brothers and 2 sisters. (1 Chronicles 2:13-17) and his name means "the beloved". David loved to pray and praise the name of God while playing on his harp.



The Lord is a Light to Our Path

St. Mark the Apostle

The Synaxarion of the 30th day of the Coptic Month of Parmoute (May 8)

Learning how St. Mark faithfully brought the faith and knowledge of God to Egypt teaches us that God is a light to our path.

The name Mark means hammer. He was born in Cyrene from a rich Jewish family. His mother's name was Mary, and his father's name was Aristopolus. He came back to Jerusalem with his family where he met our Lord Jesus Christ. He joined the faith and became one of the 70 apostles.



St. Mark got the faith from our Lord Jesus Christ and saw many miracles. The Coptic Orthodox Church calls him:

- 1- The Beholder of God (Witness of God)
- 2- The Evangelist
- 3- The Apostle

Mary, the mother of St. Mark served our Lord Jesus Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ had the first Holy Communion in her house, in the upper room. Her house became the first Christian church in the world.






Also, after our Lord Jesus Christ rose to Heaven, the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in the house of the mother of St. Mark. Then they started teaching in Jerusalem and many other places.

St. Mark performed many miracles in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. He talked to many people about the Lord Jesus Christ, teaching them the faith, and how the Lord is the light to our life.

St. Mark went to teach in the city of Alexandria. When he came to the city, his shoe was broken. He went to a shoemaker in the city named Anianus to fix it. While he was fixing his shoe the tool hurt his finger. Anianus shouted "O, ONE GOD." When St. Mark heard these words, he talked to him about the One God. St. Mark prayed, and his finger was healed.



Anianus believed in the Lord Jesus Christ and the faith. St. Mark baptized him and his family in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This was the start of Christianity in Egypt.



St. Mark made the first church in Egypt. He made St. Anianus a bishop as well as 3 priests and 7 deacons for the city of Alexandria in Egypt. Then the church started to grow each day.






1- St. Mark is the 1st Pope of Alexandria:

The same faith St. Mark got from the Lord Jesus Christ he gave to every pope after him.

Today, **Pope Tawadros, the 118th Pope,** stays with the same faith.

That's why the Pope is named on the **See of St. Mark.**





2- He made the Theological School of Alexandria:

To teach the entire world about God.







3- He wrote the Holy Liturgy: one of the oldest liturgies of the church.





4- **He wrote one** of the 4 gospels, The Gospel of St. Mark.

St. Mark was a light to everyone around him by teaching others about God in the land of Egypt.

He is called 'The Preacher of Egypt.'

He also taught others about the Lord Jesus Christ by writing the Gospel. This is why He is called an 'evangelist.'

It is our turn and duty to keep the faith unchanged as we received it just like St. Mark.

May the prayers of St. Mark be with us all.


